BUSINESS ARISING

IMPACT OF COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAMMING

A report addressing the Board's question at the September 10th Board Meeting re: measuring the effectiveness of comprehensive school health programs, such as APPLE Schools, is attached for information.

ITEMS FOR INFORMATION

SCHOOL COUNCIL YEAR PLANNING

School Councils are in the process of conducting their organizational meetings and electing executive members and identifying dates. As that information is gathered it will be distributed to trustees. The practice of developing speaking notes for trustees following each board meeting will continue this year and those notes will also be distributed to principals for them to share, in the event trustees are unable to attend a meeting.

Attached to this report is a draft year plan for school councils developed by Kim Frykas, Director of System Planning, to support principals and school councils in the development of Council year plans. The distribution of this document is intended to support new principals and new school council chairs in the organization of their work and to provide consistency of practice and two-way information sharing across all schools in the division. The year plan identifies the required information principals are expected to share, identified in the [School Councils Regulation](#) and [Administrative Procedure 110 – School Councils](#). The draft plan also provides suggestions for other content while leaving autonomy for principals to include in their updates information specific to the context of their schools.

ENROLLMENT UPDATE

The registration of new students has largely stabilized at this point in the school year and system and school leadership are working to finalize student information across the division in preparation for the submission of student enrollments to Alberta Education at the end of September. The final student enrollment summary will be presented at the October 8 board meeting, but at this point it appears that while the division continues to grow, less growth than projected occurred and is a deviation from the trend of the last two years. More details about student movement in and out of the division will be included in the October 8 report.

SEPTEMBER 11 PRINCIPALS MEETING

Significant time was allocated to support administrators to plan the professional learning in their schools and for principals to collaborate and explore school leadership development and mentorship practices for the purpose of supporting succession planning at the school level.

Outside of the meeting, K-8 principals have been collaborating on development of the new elementary report card and a plan to share and collect feedback from school staff on the next professional learning day. A detailed update on the progress of the development and implementation planning for the new elementary report card, and the *Guide for Parents and Guardians*, will be shared with trustees at the October 8 meeting, to support trustees speaking to the work at school council meetings.

NORTHWESTERN POLYTECHNIC (NWP) ACADEMIC SHOWCASE

On Monday, September 16 Northwestern Polytechnic hosted high school academic counsellors, off-campus programming support staff, school administrators and system leaders to provide an update on the programming and support available to students that are currently offered at NWP. GPPSD high schools were well-represented and heard from the Registrar's office, from the student supports department, and from each of the departments that offer post-secondary certificate, diploma, university transfer, and bachelor's degree programs. NWP shared information about several new programs that will begin in the second semester of this year and in the 2025-2026 academic year and announced that registration for next year is open to current grade 12 students now. SUMMER SCHOOL SUMMARY

July saw the successful return of high school summer school programming for division students. 53 students, supported by 5 staff, had the opportunity to enroll in 11 in-person courses and 10 online courses. Students also had the opportunity to participate in work experience and RAP programming. In total, students earned 1101 total credits earned over the summer (168 summer school, 818 work experience, and 115 RAP).

The July program is considered a successful pilot based on the number of students who participated and high school principals have met with system leadership to review and begin planning for next year. It is expected that programming for July 2025 will build on the initial success and will see increased student participation in the summer of 2025 because of opening registration earlier and modifying programming based on student and staff feedback and the lessons learned from this year.

CAREERS PATHWAYS PLANNING

The Division's 3-year education plan includes *Outcome 2: Students are supported to succeed from early learning to high school completion and beyond*. System leadership is working with school administration to develop and implement a Career Pathways Framework to support this outcome, which will provide clarity for students, parents, and staff about the opportunities for students. The Framework will also support division administration to enhance existing programming and develop new opportunities for students.

Deputy Superintendent James Robinson, Kimberly Frykas, Director of System Planning, and Dennis Vobeyda, Principal at the Grande Prairie Composite High School, have participated in a variety of provincial conferences to support their planning for preparing students for life after high school. Building networks across the province and using research into effective programs in Alberta and other jurisdictions has led to the development this summer of a draft *Framework for Implementing Career Pathways*, a three year implementation plan, and identified resource recommendations. Kimberly Frykas and Dennis Vobeyda will chair a division committee this year, that will engage with staff, parents, students, industry, community, and post-secondary to inform and finalize the division framework. The

Board will receive more detailed information and a presentation later in the school year, as the work continues to evolve.

The Framework outlines multiple pathways and a continuum of support that teaches students to self-reflect, set goals, and persevere. Partnership opportunities with industry, family, post-secondary and community will be identified as they broaden student exploration and experiences. The Framework is developed to provide equitable access to opportunities for students and families to learn about career pathways and the development of the readiness skills to prepare them for life after school.

In addition, the Division is collaborating with Northwestern Polytechnic, Grande Prairie and District Catholic Schools, and the Peace Wapiti Public School Division to review current Dual Credit programming, develop new pathways and explore the development of a Collegiate School with a STEM focus.

SCHOOL MESSENGER COMMUNICATION PLATFORM

As communication between home and school continues to be identified as important in annual division surveys, a new strategy is being implemented this school year. *School Messenger* was deployed to parents in September 2024, and is a comprehensive engagement platform that supports effective communication between school and home in a variety of ways:

1. **Communicating to parents:** information about school events, newsletters, and other important news.
2. **Attendance reporting:** Streamlined reporting of student absences by parents using app, web, or phone.
3. **Safe arrival:** Reporting directly to parents if a student does not arrive at school.
4. **Emergency communications:** Efficient mass communication capabilities in the event of an emergency.

School Messenger has been used at the high school level for several years and is being deployed division wide for all parents. Parents are required to set up an account, can select the types of communication they would like to receive, and can identify their preferred means of communication. *School Messenger* is integrated with *PowerSchool*, our student information system, which simplifies the process and improves the accuracy of contact information, for parents, schools and the division. While the premise is relatively simple, implementation is relatively complex across the division and system leadership, Information Technology staff, and school staff have developed a comprehensive workplan to support implementation.

SYSTEM LEADERSHIP REPORTS TO THE BOARD FOR 2024-2025

This report, and the attached report from the Associate Superintendent of Business Services for this meeting, introduces a new structure for information reports to the board prepared by system leadership staff. The schedule for administrative reports to the board has been developed, and continues to evolve, over time to support the Board's governance actions. The purpose of the new template is to make visible each report's connection to legislation, policy and procedure and to connect each report to the Board's core governance responsibilities: fiduciary (oversight), strategic (foresight), generative (insight).

The development and implementation of the new template by system leaders is also an opportunity to enhance the understanding of system leadership staff regarding the ways in which operations in each of

their portfolio areas supports board governance. Directors will continue to attend board meetings to provide a short summary of the purpose and content of each report and to answer questions from trustees. To support effective discussion, trustees are asked to consider submitting their questions to the Superintendent on the Monday or Tuesday of the week of the board meeting so system leadership staff may come prepared to provide an answer.

Guidelines

School Education Plan (Sept, Jan-June)

School Administrators, in collaboration with staff, develop school education plans. School Councils have the opportunity to provide advice and feedback on the development of the School's Annual Education Plan. The School Education Plan will be shared at the beginning of each year and should be referenced throughout the year.

Annual School Council Reporting Requirements (submit to Central Office by September 30)

- each school council will submit their report to the Board by Sept 30 yearly
- reports will include:
 - financial statements of any money handled by the School Council
 - activities of the school council for the preceding year
 - School Council Grant – details of expenditures

School Education Results Report (October - December)

School Administrators, in collaboration with staff, develop annual school education results reports that align with their School Plan. School Councils have the opportunity to provide advice and feedback on the development of the Annual Results Report.

Provincial Assessment Results (October – December)

School Administrators will provide the School Council with the results for the school from provincial assessments (Provincial Achievement Tests grades 6 and 9, and Diploma Exams), an interpretation of those results for the school by the end of December.

GPPSD School Council Chairs Meetings (November/December, January/February, May)

The Grande Prairie Public School Division Central Office Administration and School Board meets with School Council Chairs and representatives in November, January, and May to seek their input into key areas of direction, and to share results for the school from provincial assessments, and interpretation of those results.

Division & School Calendar (December – January)

School Administrators will provide draft calendar(s) and build understanding with School Council of the process and parameters considered when developing the calendar. Feedback from School Council will be shared with Central Office.

School Budget Updates (schedule determined by Principal and School Council)

School Administrators will provide an overview of the school budget and fees. School Councils can offer suggestions on school budget priorities, expenditure allocations, instructional and other fees.

School Fees (April)

AP 505: School Assessed Fees outlines principals, in consultation with School Councils and the Superintendent, may propose school fees.

Board Policy 16: Student Fees indicates that the “consulting process will be documented and must include an explanation of why a change in any fees or costs was required.”
